School profile

Helidon State School provides an inclusive small school environment staffed by caring people who are responsive to the needs of all students. We provide high quality education that makes a positive difference to the lives of our students. We equip young people for the future to enable them to contribute to a socially, economically and culturally vibrant society. Helidon State School is a co-educational state school situated between Gatton and Toowoomba (about a 20-minute drive to each). There are about 110 students currently at the school from Prep to year 6. The school has most of the services of a 'big school' such as access to a Learning Support Teacher, Music Teacher, PE Teacher, Guidance Officer as well as visiting teachers. An Instrumental Music Program operates for students in Years 4 - 6. We offer a Breaky Club twice a week before school. The school is growing production partnerships with a range of community organisations and individuals.

Have regular whole-school meetings to discuss how we can improve and assign tasks to staff. Provide opportunities and funding for staff to attend training and development programs.
