WHY A UNIFORM?

The wearing of a school uniform helps a child to feel they belong to their school. It helps our students to adopt the good manners, the behaviour and the positive attitude to learning expected by the school. On visits away from the school, teachers find it easier to supervise children who are wearing their school uniform. It is hoped that your child will be able to have at least one uniform which can be worn on several days each week including special occasions, school excursions and sports days. The children are expected to wear the school uniform every day.

There are a limited number of second hand uniforms available for purchase.

A Year 7 uniform was introduced in 1998. This was introduced to help identify our school leaders to visitors to our school as well as younger students.

Inappropriate Dress is not permitted at the school.

Inappropriate dress refers to clothing or apparel the student wears that is, or could be deemed to be:

- (a) offensive; e.g. displaying offensive language, signs, images or symbols, etc.
 - (b) likely to disrupt, or negatively influence, the normal operation of the school;
 - (c) unsafe for the student or others; e.g. large earrings, necklaces, etc. likely to result in a risk to the health of the student or others e.g. lack of a hat, shoes, dirty clothing etc. Students are permitted to wear a wrist watch, studs or sleepers in ears and necklaces which have a health or religious significance. This rule has been formulated in keeping with Work Place Health and Safety guidelines. Students are discouraged from wearing make-up, including finger nail polish. Closed-toe footwear should be worn at all times. Thongs and high-heeled shoes are not permitted for safety reasons.
- The objective is to have all students uphold the dress code, however, the school is aware of circumstances where temporary exemptions may be required e.g.
 - o For new students to the school
 - o While students await the purchase of a replacement lost or stolen item e.g. a hat
 - o Where inclement weather makes uniforms unavailable
